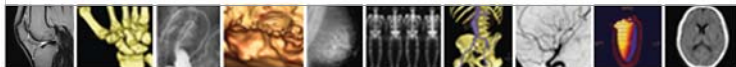

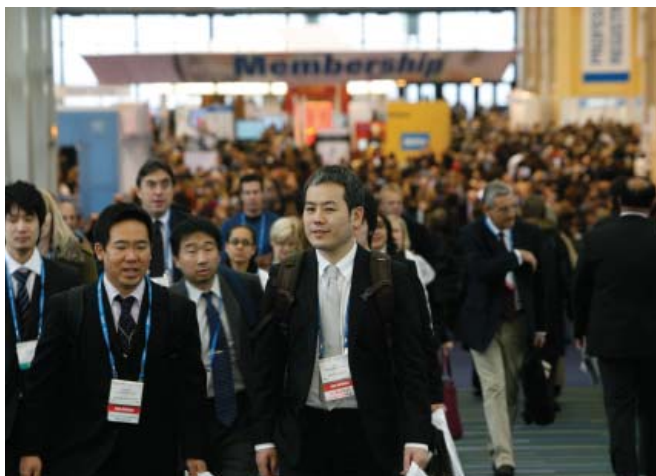

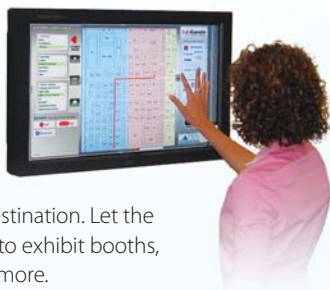

Dr Gambhir is head of the Nuclear Medicine department and Director of Medical Imaging

One of 35 members of the National Cancer Institute, he is the developer of many of the original FDG-PET management algorithms for patients with cancer, including cost-effectiveness models that led to FDG-PET reimbursement by Medicare. Dr Gambhir runs a translational science laboratory that has developed several strategies for studying basic cellular and molecular biological events, such as imaging protein-protein interactions, protein phosphorylation, and cell trafficking in living subjects.

Dr Gawande is research director for the Brigham and Women's Hospital Center for Surgery and

He is also the author of *Complications*, *Better*, and New York Times bestseller *The Checklist Manifesto*, and was #5 on the Thinkers list in this year's TIME 100. Dr Gawande leads the World Health Organization's global campaign to reduce avoidable deaths in surgery and child delivery. He is the recipient of the MacArthur Fellowship for his writing and efforts to improve surgical practice.

Greening RSNA 2010

RSNA is committed to hosting one of the greenest and cleanest meetings in the industry. And it's making a difference. The diversion (recycling) rate for RSNA 2009 was 74 percent, an increase over the 70 percent diversion rate for RSNA 2008. We expect this year's rate to be even higher.

What we're doing:

- Nature of the emergency

- Phone number from which you are calling
- Exact location—if you are inside any of the exhibit halls, provide the letter/number of the nearest column.

Remain calm.

- Do not hang up until you are sure no further information is required, unless there is an immediate threat to your safety.
- If conditions are safe, wait for the arrival of emergency personnel and assist in directing them to the appropriate location.
- If you cannot leave an ill or injured person to call security, call out loudly, *"Help, medical emergency (and your location)."*

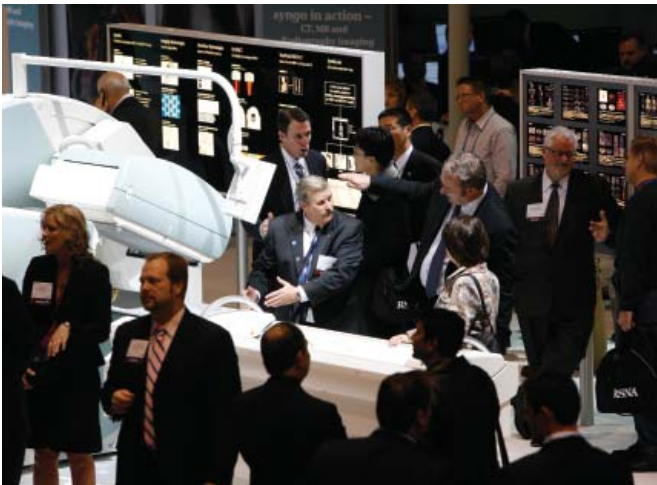

Getting to/from Chicago Airports

Chicago Transit Authority (CTA)

The CTA's convenient and easy to use bus and elevated/subway train lines—including the famous “L”—carry you around town and to major attractions. The CTA website (www.transitchicago.com) offers a valuable overview of transit services, a guide to the system, instructions for first-time riders and much more.

Chicago-O’Hare International Airport (ORD) is served by the Blue Line (CTA ‘L’ train route) which stops at Terminal 2. Blue Line trains serve O’Hare 24 hours per day, seven days per week. Trains operate every few minutes during the day and every 15-30 minutes overnight.

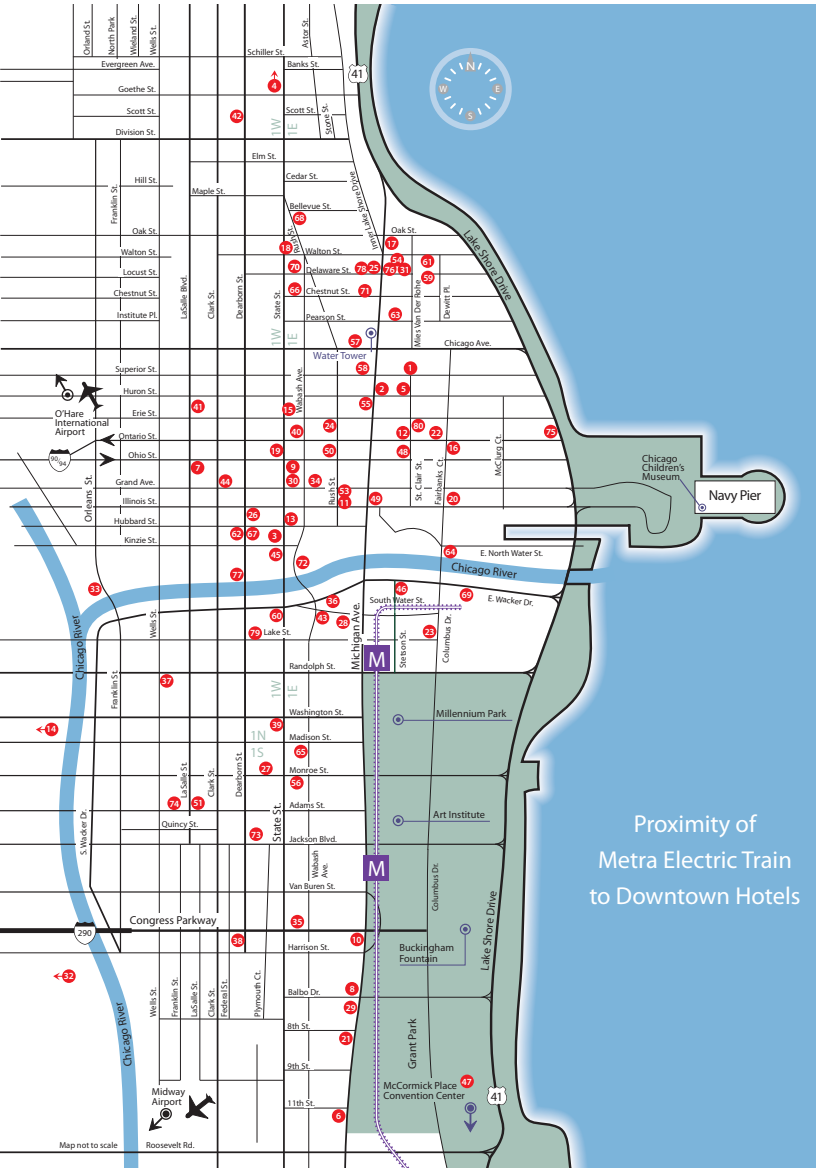
Station Information

The Van Buren/Jackson Street Station is below ground on Michigan Avenue between Jackson and Van Buren Streets. Street access is on Michigan Avenue at the northeast, northwest and southwest corners at Van Buren Street.
